

How Can I Respect Others?

Learning Objectives

- I can identify and apply strategies for establishing and respecting others' personal space, boundaries, and belongings (1.2n, 1.3n).

Teacher Notes

- The video covers each of the three areas (personal space boundaries and belongings) in 3 mini lessons that each include a physical activity.
- Vocabulary: personal space, boundaries, and belongings
- Students will need a ball, 5-6 small objects (e.g. sock balls), and a blanket or a piece of clothing. Spots are indicated in the video to pause and collect the needed equipment.
- This one is pretty straight forward.

Lesson Steps: Video Outline

Step 1 Introduction

- Ask before the video: What does the word respect mean? Can you give me an example of how you can be respectful?
- The video introduces the video as mentioned above.

Step 2 Activity

- Three mini lessons, each with a physical activity at the end.

Step 3 Closure

- The video summarizes specific ways the students learned to respect others' space, belongings and boundaries.
- Ask after the video: How are you good at respecting others? Are there some ways you could improve?

Assessments

- Pre-Assessment- Call and Response: What does the word respect mean? Can you give me an example of how you can be respectful? [If students can't think of anything, this is a great chance

for the teacher to compliment each student, telling them one way they have been respectful to you.]

- Post-Assessment- Call and Response: Ask after the video: How are you good at respecting others? Are there some ways you could improve? [This is a great time to problem solve or even have classmates compliment each other on how they've been respectful to each other.]

Extensions/Connections/Applications

- Have students write out one way they will be respectful to each of their family members before you meet again as a class.
