

## Positive Interactions

### Learning Objectives

- I can explain the importance of responsible behaviors when interacting with others. [1.2.o]
- I can explain how to listen and use words to respond to help solve problems. [1.2.p]

### Teacher Notes

- Students will need a stuffie for this activity (or some other kind of small object such as a paper wad)
- Students will be given a scenario and they will act out their own response with their object (teacher can pause video and call on a student or two to share how they responded)
- Students will then use their stuffie to complete the exercise challenge before being given the next scenario
- Responsible behaviors include sharing, following directions, listening, cooperating, respecting the space of others, using manners, taking turns and communicating.

#### *Step 1 Introduction*

- Screen On or Screen Off: Keep your screen on if you feel you know how to interact with others and solve problems when you need to. Turn your screen off if you feel you need help learning how to better interact with others and solve problems.

#### *Step 2 Activity*

- Today we are learning about responsible behaviors when we interact with others
- We are also learning how to be better listeners and use our words when trying to solve problems.
- Responsible behaviors include sharing, following directions, listening, cooperating, respecting the space of others, using manners, taking turns and communicating.

#### *Step 3 Closure*

- Keep your screen on if you feel more confident in being able to interact with others responsibly and use your words to help solve problems. Turn your screen off if you don't.



## **Assessments**

- Pre-Assessment: Screen On/Screen Off - Keep your screen on if you feel you know how to interact with others and solve problems when you need to. Turn your screen off if you feel you need help learning how to better interact with others and solve problems.
- Post-Assessment: Screen On/Screen Off - Keep your screen on if you feel more confident in being able to interact with others responsibly and use your words to help solve problems. Turn your screen off if you don't.
