Grade 5 Sample Lesson Plan: Classified Ad - ISO

Objectives/Goals

- The student will be able to
 - o define what having a positive self-image means
 - advocate for their themselves and identify qualities and characteristics that make them an asset to their community

Materials

- Classified Ad, ISO Slides/Presentations
- Classified Ad, ISO Personal Inventory
- Classified Ad, ISO Worksheet
- Video <u>"How Do YOU Define Yourself Lizzie Velasquez at TEDxAustinWomen" https://youtu.be/c62Aqdlzvqk</u>

Steps

- This lesson very well could take two class periods. There is a 13 minute video that is impactful, but could be skipped to reduce the length of this lesson.
- Have the first slide up (Classified Ad, ISO Slides/Presentation) as the students enter the classroom
- Have them self-reflect on the questions posed.
- Who are you?
- What are you good at?
- What positive personality traits do you have?
- What is self-esteem?
- Do you have a positive self-image?
- They could focus on one or two of the questions and journal their answers or just think about them.
- Slide 2 Ask them "What is self-esteem?" Discuss the answer it's "how we understand and value ourselves."
- Explain that someone can have a high self-esteem or a low self-esteem.

- Have them brainstorm and list what a high self-esteem looks like and what a low self-esteem looks like.
- Slide 3 Ask students "What is self-image?" Make sure they aren't answering that it's the same as self-esteem. Direct them towards the answer that self-image is "How you see yourself and how you believe others see you."
- Explain how they are closely connected because if you have a poor opinion of yourself you'll have a low self-esteem.
- Slide 4 Give each student a Classified Ad, ISO Personal Inventory worksheet.
- Explain that they'll be answering questions about themselves and they should be honest with their answers. This won't be graded, but used later to help complete a classified ad.
- As they finish, which may be at different times, have them reflect on what they learned about themselves anything new or interesting? How they can apply this to their life? Does it affect any goals they may have?
- Slide 5 Show the video "How Do YOU Define Yourself Lizzie Velasquez"
- Slide 6 Ask them "How do you define yourself?" "Is it different now that you've completed your personal inventory and viewed the video featuring Lizzie Velasquez?"
- Slide 7 & 8 Give each student the Classified Ad, ISO Worksheet and explain that they
 will be using the information from their personal inventory to help complete this
 assignment.
- You may need to discuss and tell them what a classified ad is prior to the completion of this worksheet.
- This advertisement is to help others get to know you. Like a personal ad you are 'selling' yourself as a friend.
- You want to share your qualities and be honest.
- You'll also briefly explain what you are ISO or in search of when you are looking for a friend.
- Slide 8 Specifically point out that you are asked to list 2 flaws. Ask students "Why should you share your flaws?" Answers should help them understand that flaws aren't necessarily a bad thing. They make them unique. Also, if they are able to identify their flaws they are able to work on improving them (know is half the battle).
